#### Overview and Research Objectives

The City of San Rafael commissioned Godbe Research to conduct a telephone survey of voters with the following research objectives:

- a) Assess overall perceptions of living in San Rafael;
- b) Gauge satisfaction with the City's performance in providing services and programs;
- c) Evaluate perceptions of the condition of City facilities;
- d) Assess awareness of the City's financial situation;
- e) Gather feedback on preferred information sources and City communications; and
- f) Identify differences in opinions due to demographic and/or behavioral characteristics.




### Ratings of San Rafael




### Problems Facing San Rafael

What is the single, largest problem facing the City of San Rafael today?




## Change in Local Neighborhood Traffic

Do you feel local taxes in San Rafael are too high, too low, or just about right?






### Spending Taxpayers' Money

Are you satisfied or dissatisfied with the job the City of San Rafael is doing in spending taxpayers' money?




#### Satisfaction with Overall City Services

In general, are you satisfied or dissatisfied with the job the City of San Rafael is doing to provide City services?















### City's Financial Situation


In your opinion, would you say the City's financial situation is excellent, good, fair, or poor?




### Awareness of City Online Information

The City of San Rafael provides information on local services and events through several online sources. Please tell me if you were aware that the City offers information through each of the following:




#### City Website Use (334 Aware Voters)

How often do you visit the City's website?




### Ratings of the City's Website

How informative is the City's website to you? Would you say it is . . .




### Social Networking Website Use

Are you, or anyone in your household, a member of social networking websites, such as Facebook or Twitter?




#### Preferred City Information Source

Executive Summary

- San Rafael residents are highly satisfied with quality of life, and the city ranks among the highest satisfaction scores in California to date.
- Residents' concerns largely reflect current events, and these have changed significantly from previous surveys. Residents currently are more concerned with the City's financial situation and availability of jobs, whereas they are less concerned with traffic congestion.
- Residents continue to be highly satisfied with the job the City of San Rafael is doing to provide services, and the performance of City Council.
- Residents also reported high satisfaction with a wide range of City services. For 17 services, residents as a whole were between "somewhat" and "very satisfied." Further, for all 28 services, satisfied residents outnumbered dissatisfied residents.
- When compared to 2009, satisfaction has increased with the City's efforts to manage traffic, provide affordable housing, provide sufficient parking downtown, and meet the needs of ethnic minorities.
- In contrast, satisfaction has decreased slightly with the City's efforts to provide street sweeping, tree trimming, and maintain median strips.
- Overall, this high satisfaction with quality of life and City services indicates that residents' opinions are resilient to recent changes in service levels.

- The results suggest that residents are becoming more informed of the City's financial situation. At the same time, just half of residents are aware of the recent cuts in funding and staffing, so many would benefit from additional information.
- A majority of residents are aware that the City website provides information on local services and events, whereas residents are less aware of other online sources, such as email newsletters (34%).
- Ratings of the City's website are significantly more positive than in the 2007 survey.
- Although roughly half of residents are members of social networking websites, the results show that an overwhelming majority of residents would prefer to receive information from the City through other sources, including a printed newsletter (43%), email (32%), or the City website (13%).
